Outcome: To use watercolours to create a picture in the style of Natalie Pascoe



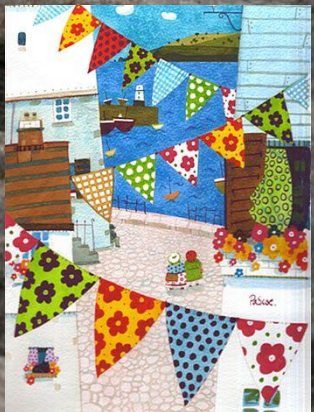
Use a variety of tools and techniques including the use of different brush sizes and types.

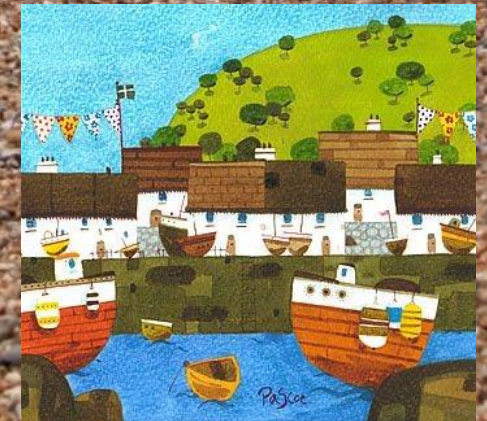
